THIS WEEK'S LESSON: THE HISTORY BOOKS



IN THE CAR:

Ask your child what they learned about this week on the drive home:

The books of history tell us what happened to God's people when they inherited the Promised Land and what happened when they forgot about God. These books are filled with many exciting stories that all have the same basic message: obey God and you can overcome any obstacle just like David or disobey God and you will surely fail like Saul. 1 Samuel 17:4-11 and 32-49, 1 Samuel 28:17-18, David & Goliath, Saul's Reign Comes To An End



HANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:

Ask your kids if they can remember the history books of the Bible and teach you the hand motions: Joshua, Judges, Ruth, 1 Samuel, 2 Samuel, 1 Kings, 2 Kings, 1 Chronicles, 2 Chronicles, Ezra, Nehemiah, and Esther.
