THIS WEEK'S LESSON: MINOR PROPHETS



IN THE CAR:

Ask your child what they learned about this week on the drive home: Jonah is probably the most famous of the Minor Prophets. Being swallowed by a fish is a pretty memorable story. But Jonah's story isn't just a big fish story. Like all of the Minor Prophets, Jonah's story points us towards our need for repentance and God's forgiveness. In the story of Jonah, we see examples of repentance by both Jonah and the people of Nineveh. We see an example of Jesus' sacrificial death when Jonah is swallowed by the fish for three days to save the crew from the storm. And we also see that God's forgiveness is freely given to those who don't deserve it. Jonah 1 and Jonah 3



THANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:

Ask your kids if they can remember the Minor Prophets and teach you the hand motions: Hosea, Joel, Amos, Obadiah, Jonah, Micah, Nahum, Habakkuk, Zephaniah, Haggai, Zechariah, and Malachi.
